January 8 through January 14, 2023

If our Lord had not sanctified the waters of Baptism by His own baptism, then we would have no benefit in this water. In this baptism, our Lord joins the ranks of sinners who call upon the mercy of the Father. Though He is the Holy One of Israel, He willingly comes to the waters to exchange His holiness for our sinfulness. Our Lord desires to fulfill all righteousness, that is, to fill us up with His own righteousness in our baptisms. There the Father declares to the world that we are the beloved sons of the Father in heaven. This water is not simple water, for the command and promise of God are attached to it. In baptism, the Father reveals that we are sons of God, even though we remain sinners in the eyes of the world until the day of our death. As the Father once announced to the world that the Divine Son of God was hidden in the Son of Man Jesus, so now we can take comfort in His declaration that we are His own dear children hidden in these weak mortal bodies.

**INVOCATION:** In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **AMEN. THE CREED** 

**VERSE:** <sup>38</sup> Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. <sup>39</sup> For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself.

# **CATECHISM FOR THE WEEK: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism**

What is Baptism?

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

Which is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." *Matthew* 28:19

What benefits does Baptism give?

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." *Mark* 16:16

Luther on Genesis 47:26 (1545): But he did not teach astronomy or astrology, as the Jews dream. No, he taught how to know and worship the true God. And he had an excellent opportunity to do this because of the very illustrious miracle God had performed through him during the seven years of the famine. For experience was added to teaching, and the people saw this wonderful preservation of the whole kingdom and of several neighboring nations. All wondered from what source he had such wisdom that he predicted the famine so exactly and prepared so diligently for the necessities of life.

To this Joseph added the many outstanding sermons which the priests heard from him. They embraced the doctrine concerning God and spread it throughout the world. For he taught them the true religion and the wisdom of God. Yet he did not force ceremonies on them, circumcision or the observance of other rites. But he was careful to impress on them that they should believe in God, who had promised the Seed that was to come. And perhaps he also tolerated some of their own ceremonies—ceremonies which were not altogether godless and which he did not condemn but applied to the true service and worship of God.

Accordingly, Joseph was a great man, especially in spiritual matters, although he was by no means inferior in political matters. David praises both qualities (cf. Ps. 105:20–22). Nor was Joseph lazy; but wherever he had opportunities to do so, he taught and exhorted the people to embrace the pure doctrine. And there is no doubt that through him very many Egyptians were led to the true knowledge of God and were saved.

But he taught about God, who gave the promise at the very beginning in Paradise, later repeated the same promise rather frequently, and spoke to the fathers Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. For so much he himself knew, and he had nothing from the Bible except the history of Abraham, which begins in the 12<sup>th</sup> chapter of Genesis, and the preceding 10 chapters concerning the creation. Of these he had the knowledge that was handed down through the fathers. At that time the Bible was a small book, but it contained the greatest and most important things of all.

Yet we must not think that Joseph converted all Egypt and all the princes and citizens. For nowhere is there an example where one kingdom with all its subjects was improved and regulated in such a way that no vestiges of godless people and of idolatry remained. Look at the kingdom of Judah and Israel even under David and the best kings and prophets! While they ruled and taught, many evil and godless people were mingled in. Nevertheless, it was a saintly and godly kingdom because of the church, which at that time was among the people of Israel. # **READINGS**

Amos 9:11-15 Ephesians 5:22-33 John 2:1-11

Amos, the prophet, cries out about the faithful Bridegroom of Israel who will restore Her and cause the hills to flow with an abundance of good wine. Those whom He would destroy would be rebuilt by the Son of God. So Jesus comes to Cana on the third day, which shall also be the day of His resurrection, for He will rebuild the temple in three days. The water points to the baptismal discussion with Nicodemus in John 3, and the wine foreshadows the discussion of the abundant blessings and joy of the Lord's Supper in John 6. These two signs find their power in the blood and water which flow from the side of Christ at His death. The resurrection of Christ is the confirmation that we shall share in the benefits of the resurrection through these two sacraments. Here the bride and bridegroom are nameless, for they are simply the descendants of Adam and Eve suffering under the curse of sin. These are the ones to whom Christ brings His gracious deliverance and joy. We are those nameless descendants of our first parents who need the forgiveness that Christ pours out upon us in the Church through the means of His sacraments. The glory of Christ is revealed before us in the water of Holy Baptism as the baptized are washed by the blood of Christ. See it once more as the body and blood are offered to us on the altar for the forgiveness of our sins. There Christ reveals Himself to the eyes of faith that we might know our Bridegroom as the source of all mercy.
