#### **Closed Communion**

The Sacrament of Holy Communion is celebrated today. As a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we follow the historic Christian practice of closed communion. According to the words of St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 11, only those who share the same outward confession of faith join us at the altar. Members of other LC-MS congregations are welcome, but we ask that you please see the pastor before communing. If you arrive too late to do this before the service, please introduce yourself to the pastor after the service.

#### Visitors

We welcome you. Please sign the guest book and introduce yourself to the Pastor. Also complete a blue attendance card located in the pews and put an X in the () if you will be communing with us. We invite you to join us for Bible Study on Sundays at 9:30 a.m. in the school gym.

#### Passiontide

As the passion of Our Lord's crucifixion and resurrection draws nearer, the church observes an even deeper reflection on the pain, suffering, and sacrifice of Jesus for our life and forgiveness. While the fourth Sunday in Lent (Laetare) gave a brief reprieve from the penitential nature of Lent, the fifth Sunday in Lent (Judica) brings even greater anticipation of Good Friday. Judica is sometimes called "Passion Sunday," which is the beginning of Passiontide: Judica, Palmarum, and Holy Week. For that reason, on Judica, the crosses are veiled as Jesus leaves the temple in humble expectation of the cross and Passion of Jesus Christ. The gauzy black material used to veil is black, like that of a widow's mourning veil. Historically, paintings would be veiled also, and any artistic triptychs closed. During Passiontide, the less Gloria Patri ("Glory Be To the Father...") is omitted when used with psalmody and canticles, just as the Alleluias and the greater Gloria in Excelsis are omitted during the Gesimatide (Pre-Lent) and Lent seasons. This means that the end of the Nunc Dimittis and Magnificat is removed until the joy of the resurrection in Easter Season. The next Sunday in Passiontide (Palmarum) continues with the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem: Hosanna to the Son of David! Palm Sunday is part of Passiontide leading into Holy Week, hence its name, Palmarum. Thus, the Sunday before Easter includes both the festive waving of palm branches as well as the restrained reverence of the Passion of Our Lord. Palmarum often includes both the procession with palms and also the lengthy reading of the passion of Our Lord.





Jesus draws us to the altar to pronounce His Father's judgment of joy as we eat His flesh and drink His blood to have life. The Judge forgives our sins in this Supper and sends us away in His peace. Faith finds its hope in this word of God, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." In the Judge's word declared publicly over us at the altar, we are delivered from deceitful and unjust men.

Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right.

Luther, Large Catechism, Sacrament of the Altar (1528): You will certainly also, in addition to the flesh and the world, have the devil about you. Him you will not completely tread under foot because not even our Lord Christ could entirely avoid His temptations. Now, what is the devil? Nothing else than what the Scripture calls him, a liar and a murderer. He is a liar who seduces the heart away from God's Word and blinds it so that you become insensitive to your need and unable to come to Christ. He is a murderer who begrudges you every hour of your life. If you could see how many of his

knives, spears, and arrows are aimed at you every moment, you would be glad to come to the Sacrament as often as you can. The one reason why we go about so heedlessly in our false sense of security is that we do not admit or believe that we are living in the flesh, in the world, and in the devil's domain. Here, therefore, is something for you to try; practice it well: Look down deep into yourself, look round about you a little, and simply hold to what Scripture says about it all. If after doing this you still feel no need of the Sacrament, then you have all the more reason to lay your trouble before both God and your brother. Seek the counsel of others, and let them pray for you, and be sure not to give up until the rocky crust of your heart is broken. The trouble you are in will then be laid open to view, and you will become aware that you have sunk twice as low as any other poor sinner and are in much greater need than he of the Sacrament in order to overcome the misery which, unfortunately, you did not see. Be sure to do this. God may give you grace to become more sensitive to your need and hungrier for the Sacrament. You should do this especially because in his attempt to capture and ruin you, soul and body, the devil is pressuring and pursuing you so hard that you cannot be safe from him for a single hour. How much he would like to bring you into sudden misery and trouble when you least expect it! Let this serve as an exhortation not only for us older grown-ups but also for the young people who are to be brought up in Christian doctrine and its right understanding. It might help to make it easier to instill the Ten Commandments, the Creed, and the Lord's Prayer into the young, so that they would gladly and genuinely accept them and put them early into habitual use. For we are really at the point where we can do no more with older people in order to assure the perpetuation of these and similar teachings. All we can expect to do is to train the people who are to come after us and step into our office and work so that, in their turn, they will bring up their children well. In this way, God's Word and the Christian church will be preserved. Therefore, let every head of a family remember that God's injunction and command makes him responsible to teach his children, or to have them taught, what they know. Having been baptized and taken up into the Christian church, the young people should also enjoy this fellowship of the Sacrament so that they may become useful and of service to us. For surely they are all to help us to live lives of faith, love, and prayer, and to fight against the devil. (CPH, 1978, pp. 120-121)

# LOOKING FORWARD TO PALM SUNDAY/SUNDAY OF THE PASSION PALMARUM

April 13, 2025 "His Blood Be on Us and Our Children"

#### READINGS

Zechariah 9:9-12 Philippians 2:5-11 Matthew 26:1-27:66

They had come to the feast to sacrifice a lamb, and Jesus would be that Lamb. The use of palms recalls the Old Testament Feast of Tabernacles or Booths, which commemorated the wanderings in the wilderness by erecting booths or tent-like structures made of palms. John had begun the Gospel with a reference to the Word tabernacling in the flesh (1:14). The palms before Jesus are a confession of that truth and that He is the true Savior who has come among His people. Indeed, it was God who made the children of Israel dwell in booths when He brought them out of Egypt, but it was also God who brought an end to those booths when they entered into the Promised Land (Leviticus 23:33-44). The new Joshua, Jesus, has come to his people to bring great gladness (Nehemiah 8:13-17). In John 7:2, 37, the Feast of Tabernacles was introduced. The disciples urged Jesus to show Himself to the crowds, but His hour had not yet come. Now His hour has come, and He comes to Jerusalem to pour forth living water from His side as He becomes the Passover Lamb (7:37). Here Jesus becomes the Feast of Tabernacles to which all nations are called (Zechariah 14:16-21). It is also these broken branches that foreshadow the broken hyssop branch that was used to spread the blood on the doors at the Passover.
